Small Notebook	Matches	

Make sure you eat a meal before arriving at 7:00 pm on Friday, April 5th. This is an overnight camping event, and you will be required to camp from the evening of the first day through the afternoon of the second day, about 8:00 pm. Food will be provided, so don't bring additional food OR SNACKS.

All items on the list of what to bring should be in a pack or bag that you can carry some distance. You are allowed to bring glasses (if needed), medicine and inhalers. If you have any special needs, please contact me! **We will accommodate any special needs.**

Bring the following additional things along:

Failure to have the required items and be on time at the point indicated on the map on back will result in postponing the Frontier Adventure to next year. Travel time is about 1 hr 10 mins from Loop 101 or from I-17. We will camp on the left side of the road past Seven Springs picnic areas and just before the Cave Creek Trailhead. Look for the FCF signs. The road in is not always paved and a little washboard, but not too rough – it's also windy.

No cell phone reception. Toilets are at the campsite. Bring water and plan on taking your trash out. Sites Have fire pits and concrete tables. Scrub wood is around but bring extra firewood.
